The bulk of the thesis project is dedicated to formulating a strong **argument** that you defend through a carefully constructed research design. An argument must address a clear research question, but the argument itself must be clearly constructed, easily accessible, and transparent. In addition, you should be able to establish whether or not there is enough convincing evidence to sustain that argument.

For this assignment, please structure your paper with the following bolded headings, but answer the questions according to your own projects:

Research Question: What is the research question under examination? (Length: 1 sentence)

Argument: State your argument, which directly answers your research question. (Length: 1-2 sentences)

Importance (Length: No longer than 2 lines of single-spaced text)

Why is your question important? How do you think have other scholars examined these ideas? Why do you think your contribution advances our way of thinking about this question?

Causal Mechanism (Length: No longer than 2 lines of single-spaced text)

What is the causal relationship that you are investigating? How do your two concepts relate to one another? What is the logic behind this relationship? Can you highlight the cause and effect for the reader?

The Proof (Length: No longer than a paragraph of single-spaced text)

Thinking to spring semester, how will you prove this argument? How will you collect your evidence? What is your chosen methodology or research design? Does this evidence that you want to collect exist and is it readily available to you? It is okay to be unsure and imprecise. The key is to ask questions if you are unsure and let your mind go through this process in formulating a research plan.
